Read-A-Thon

Eagle readers read over 173,000 minutes during last year's Winter Break! We are hoping to break that record this year in our 4th annual Eagle Read-a-thon! We have 3 goals this year:

1. Participation: 100% of our students will read over our 18-day Winter Break. To encourage reading, kids who read minimum specified amounts (determined by grade level) will be entered into a raffle for tons of book-related prizes like fancy book marks, book lights, Kindle readers, book accessories, journals, and of course books!
2. Fundraising: Our goal this year is to raise \$10,000 for more literacy supplies (amount includes book credits from our two Book Fairs). The most beloved books get loved to death and need replacing. Some books are lost or destroyed. New great books are published every year. If every one of our 560 students raised \$20 each, we can fulfill our goal of robust books at Edison.
3. Culturally-competent books: Edison is a 21st Century School and the books our students are surrounded by need to reflect our diverse student body and our diverse world. State of the School Address Follow up

Thank you to everyone who attended the State of the School Address in November. For those who were unable to attend, the power point has been posted at Edison's website at <http://edison.dpsk12.org/wp-content/uploads/2011/08/2017-18-State-of-the-School-Address-SPF-Presentation-Oct-2018.pdf>

During the State of the School Address meeting, parents provided the school with a lot of wonderful feedback. The community shared the following:

Edison's Strengths: Edison's values; strong teachers with pride in the Edison community; timely communication; Project-Based Learning provides opportunities for differentiation and students to pursue interests; differentiated seating has been positive.

Edison's Opportunities for Growth: Continue to work on decreasing the gap for students who receive free/reduced lunch and students of color; focus on 4th and 5th grade growth; focus on GT students; increase the number of students meeting expectations on CMAS; more effort into professional development for teachers.

Suggestions: Simplify communication to parents; appoint classroom parents for volunteering; decrease student-teacher ratio; make homework more differentiated.

Due to time limitations, some questions were unable to be answered at the State of the School Address meeting. **Below are the answers to some of your questions:**

Q- What is Edison doing to close gaps (increase achievement) for students of color, students with disabilities, and students who receive Free/Reduced Lunch?

A – Edison's primary Unified Improvement Plan goal is to increase achievement and achievement growth for students of color, students with disabilities, and students who receive Free/Reduced Lunch. We are engaging in a variety of strategies to achieve this goal:

- **Platooning in grades 4 & 5:** Platooning is a structure often used in elementary schools in which teachers specialize or become experts in either math/science or language arts. Edison's 4th & 5th grade teachers started platooning this year.
- **Project-based Learning:** In science, social studies and literacy, teachers are utilizing PBL so that they can effectively differentiate instruction, provide students opportunities to pursue interests and passions, and actively engage students in real-life experiences about the content.
- **Equity professional development:** Edison's teachers are receiving professional development to deepen their skills in teaching students of varied backgrounds and abilities.
- **Intervention model:** During math and reading, students receive interventions/support based on their skills and needs in this content area. Some students are challenged above grade level while other students receive support to accelerate their learning.
- **Tutoring:** The PTA supports after school tutoring for students who are below grade level in reading.

Q- Why do you believe that the % of GT/magnet students at Edison has decreased over the past few years?

A- The number of students in Edison's HGT magnet program has decreased only slightly over the past few years, however, the 'labels' changed. We now have three 'labels' (Magnet Eligible, Highly Gifted/Talented, and Gifted/Talented). Two years ago, the Colorado Department of Education, changed the 'rules' for GT identification. In addition, two years ago, DPS began using a new assessment tool to assess students for GT identification. With these changes, the number of GT/HGT identified students decreased, however, we added a new qualification 'Magnet Eligible'. It is now harder for students to actually qualify for GT/HGT, since students need a standardized achievement score, in addition to the cognitive assessment. At Edison, we will continue to screen all kindergarten and 2nd grade students for GT, as well as, continue to differentiate instruction to ensure that all students are challenged.

Weather Delays and Closures

Since winter is right around the corner, we want to make sure that parents understand the DPS/Edison Weather Delay and Closure policies.

Weather Delay Schedule for Identified Schools: In the event of adverse weather conditions that would impede the Transportation Department's ability to safely access students, a **"Weather Delay Schedule for Identified Schools"** will be implemented. The goal for this delay schedule is to provide buses/students an additional 60 minutes to access schools that start at 8:30 a.m. or later. If DPS has a **Weather Delay, school will begin at Edison for ALL students at 9:40 AM.** Morning buses will begin pickups at bus stops 1 hour later than the normal pick up time. Discovery Link will provide care for their registered students from 6:30 AM until 9:40 AM when school starts. Breakfast will still be available to students as they arrive to school one hour later than usual.

School Closing: If schools are to be closed due to weather conditions, the district is committed to making a decision as early as possible. The decision to close is made by the Superintendent based on information provided by representatives from transportation agencies, the weather bureau, city and county law enforcement and DPS Transportation. If school is cancelled, this information will be communicated in the following ways: local television and radio stations, dpsk12.org, and the district's [Facebook](#) and [Twitter](#) pages.

Severe Weather During School Day: DPS will closely monitor severe weather conditions and forecasts throughout the day to ensure student safety. Should severe weather begin during the school day, bus routes will run in the same order as normally followed in the afternoon. Depending on conditions, arrival times at home may be delayed. You can reach the district transportation department at 720.423.4624 for your student's bus arrival time any time it's late. After-school activities (athletic events, enrichment programs, Kaleidoscope, etc.) may be modified or cancelled as a result of the weather conditions. Edison will send IC messages to communicate school closures during the school day.

Traffic and Parking

Safety is our first priority at Edison and this starts with drop off and pick up of students. In order to make sure that all students are safe and accounted for at all times, please keep the following in mind:

- ECE students are to be dropped off and signed in in the classroom each morning and then picked up and signed out at the kindergarten playground each afternoon;
- Kindergarten students are to be dropped off/picked up on the southeast side of Quitman Street and enter/exit the building with their teachers by the kindergarten playground on the south side of the school;
- 1st-5th grade students are dropped off/picked up on the playground on the east side of the school or on the northwest side of Perry Street in the Kiss and Go/Greet and Get lane (polka-dotted);
- School buses park on the east side of the school on the southwest side of Perry Street. Please do not park or even pull over in this area;
- The parking lot is for DPS staff ONLY, please do NOT park, drop off or pick up students in the parking lot.
- All parents/community members must enter the building through the front doors, check-in at the office and get a visitor/volunteer badge.

Kiss and Go Lane: Parents who do not want to park and stay with their 1st-5th grade students on the playground in the morning may drop off their students in the student drop off lane between 8:30 AM and 8:40 AM. We ask parents to NOT park in the Kiss and Go /Greet and Get lane on the northwest side of Perry Street, outside the fence by the playground/community garden.

Greet and Get Lane: In order to help with afternoon traffic, parents who have 1st-5th grade students can sign up to have their child/ren ready and waiting at the pickup area at 3:30 PM on the northwest side of Perry Street, by the playground/community garden. Registration forms are available throughout the year in the office. The following guidelines apply:

- This is only for cars. Walkers and students of parents who park will be picked up on the playground.
- Parents should pull over on Perry Street, stay in their car, and move forward as space allows.
- Cars may only stop long enough for their child/ren to get into the car.
- Cars must continue to move and leave the parking lane immediately after picking up their children.
- Parents must pick up children at 3:30 PM. If children are not picked up on time, the teacher will bring them to the office and parents will need to find parking and come in to the office to pick the students up and sign them out.
- Only adults listed on the permission slip will be able to pick students up.

- Cell phones must not be used in the Greet and Get lane and all Colorado Motor Vehicle laws (seat belts, car seats) must be observed.
- Parents wishing to use the Greet and Get lane will need to fill out a permission form and return it to their student's teacher so that the teacher will know to send the child to the Greet and Get pick up area at 3:30 PM. These forms are available in the office.
