Budget Prioritization Process

- Megan (and Sally) will explain the budget line items, including required line items and line items we need to
 prioritize
- CSC members will rank order line items which we need to make decisions on
- CSC members will determine information to be considered if we have a significant budget deficit and need to cut classroom teachers.
- When the budget spreadsheet is received, Sally and Megan will draft a budget based on recommendations of the CSC and SLT. When the money runs out, the left over items will not be budgeted.

Budget Decisions:

- Required budget line items
 - Principal
 - Core teachers (classroom teachers) (Note: the number of classroom teachers may change based on class sizes/number of students)
 - M/M Sped (minimum amount we probably need 1.5 FTE next year)
 - Nurse (minimum amount 5 days per week or Nurse & health tech to meet 5 days/week)
 - Mental Health (psych or SW 1.0 FTE)
 - GT (can choose 3 options: No GT teacher & teachers get stipends OR 1 day/wk GT teacher OR more that 1 day GT teacher)
 - ECE teachers and paras (2 each)
 - Guest teachers for sick/personal days
- Required budget Mill Levy line items
 - Art teacher + music teacher (mill levy pays for one)
 - PE (mill levy pays for half)
 - Technology (.5 FTE teacher and hardware)
 - Team Leads and Senior Team Leads (coach or PBIS ½ day and intervention teacher ½ day)

- If we have to cut teachers, what do you want us to consider?
 - 'Justice of the many vs. Justice of the few' staffing decisions that support the greatest number of students in important

- Intervention teachers with expertise seems to be more important than intervention paraprofessionals
- Intervention paraprofessionals are very important both in the classroom and at recess. Students coming back to the classroom from recess regulated and ready to learn is very important.
- There is a fear of larger class sizes with younger students can the teacher manage students and provide quality instruction. Adult to student ratio is important.
