 - 40 minutes Reading & Written responses to reading
 - 20 minutes Spelling & Grammar



Literacy - Flooding

- Small group reading at students' instructional level
- Add (flood) grade level with 2 additional teachers & paraprofessionals
- Guided reading and/or reading intervention
- AR (Accelerated Reading) independent reading and quizzing on computers





Mathematics

- Eureka or EngageNY math
- Whole group, small group & independent work
- Add (flood) grade level with 2 additional teachers (1st-5th) & paraprofessionals
- Advanced math for those in need (above grade level)
- Individualized work on computer (IXL.com) & through stations



Unit Building Community

The Building Community Pre-Unit introduces students to the Harmony SEL program through relationship-driven activities and the establishment of Harmony Everyday Practices.



Unit 1 Being My Best Self

Students learn about who they are and their interests. They learn to connect emotions, thoughts, and feelings, regulate their emotions, engage in helpful and optimistic self-talk, and develop a growth mindset.



Unit 2 Valuing Each Other

Students learn to recognize and appreciate each others' emotions, perspectives and contributions while reflecting on the value of different lived experiences. They learn to support each other in helpful ways.



Unit 3 Communicating With Each Other


Students learn and practice the range of social skills related to communication, including non-verbal behaviors, conversation skills, and listening and responding.



Unit 4 Learning From Each Other


Students learn the value of learning from each other. They learn constructive ways to approach and resolve conflict, and to make amends for mistakes to facilitate healthy relationships.





Discovery Link Before & After School

Ages 5 and above

Early Risers: 6:30 a.m. until School start time

This morning program offers a low-key atmosphere that provides children with a positive transition to the school day. Early Risers may choose activities such as: quiet corner, arts and crafts, homework, reading time, recreational games and learning centers.

Children may participate in the school's breakfast program at the regular school fee. Breakfast participants will be dismissed from Early Risers to the breakfast program.

After School: School release time until 6 p.m.

This program provides choices for children that offer learning, playing and an opportunity to try new things. Activities include: science projects, arts and crafts, homework, group games, outdoor/gym play, learning centers.

An afternoon snack will be provided.

Choice Application Process



Northwest Elementary Enrollment Zone

Due to school closures, Edison will be joining the newly created Northwest Elementary Enrollment Zone.

Schools in the zone include:

Beach Court, Centennial, Edison, Trevista (Columbian is closing)

*** Bell times may change for 25-26 school year ***

Boundary School Transportation:

DPS students who reside in <u>enrollment zones</u>, attend a <u>school</u> <u>within that enrollment zone</u> and who <u>live more than 1 mile</u> <u>away</u> from the school they attend are eligible for stop-to-school-to-stop service on yellow buses.



Choice Process (K-S)

- All caregivers should complete a Choice Application online (except current Edison K-4 students not wishing to change schools)
 - 2025-26 school year Choice Applications will open on Jan. 15 and close on Feb. 18
 - Caregivers submit 1 choice application with top 20 schools.
 - Families of future kindergarteners will need to participate in School Choice Round 1 to secure a seat.
 - Families of ECE students must complete both the DPS School Choice application & the UPK Colorado application to apply to a DPS ECE program.
- Lottery with a prioritization process
- Wait lists students are placed on wait lists of all schools above the school they got in to.
- Please complete choice applications with your first choice being the first on the list.
 - If you get your 1st choice, your child is immediately accepted at that school and you 'give away' your potential seat at all other schools.



Choice Prioritization list (K-S)

The Choice office accepts students based on a lottery with prioritized groups

- Returning 1st-5th grade students already attending Edison (no choice application needed).
- Applicants who attend a DPS school that is closing (grades 1-5 only).
 - HGT stacked first in this group
- Applicants whose parent/guardian is a full-time staff member at this school.
- Applicants who reside in the DPS Northwest Enrollment Zone & have a sibling who currently attends or will attend the school next year.

HGT stacked first in this group

Applicants who reside in the DPS Northwest Enrollment Zone and currently attend Edison's ECE4 program. ECE4 current students must fill out a choice application.

• Applicants who live in the **Edison Proximity Zone.**



Choice Prioritization list (K-S) Continued

Applicants who reside in the DPS Northwest Elementary Enrollment Zone

- **HGT** stacked first in this group
- Students who live specifically in an area with a high concentration of students who qualify for free or reduced price lunch stacked 2nd in this group
- Applicants who reside in Denver
 - Students who have a **sibling** who attends/will attend Edison stacked 1st in this group
 - Students currently attend Edison (including ECE4 program) stacked 2nd in this group
 - HGT stacked 3rd in this group
 - Students who live specifically in an area with a high concentration of students who qualify for free or reduced price lunch stacked 4th in this group

Applicants who **do not reside in Denver** (siblings prioritized)
